

Religious Freedom for Students and Teachers of Christmastime

Americans love to celebrate Christmas, but in recent years, public schools have become confused about whether and how students and classes can commemorate the popular holiday. Since many Seventh-day Adventist students attend public schools, we offer the following counsel, so students and parents can know their rights with respect to celebrating Christmas in our nation's schools.

The constitutional rule is simple: public schools should teach about the role of religion and religious traditions in American history and culture, but should neither endorse and promote religion, or denigrate and restrict religion. The school should protect the religious freedom of all students.

Celebrating "Christmas" does not violate the constitution, as long as the public school does not celebrate Christmas just for the purpose of promoting Christianity.

Winter holiday musical programs should include a selection of secular and sacred music.

Schools can deck the halls in Christmas decorations. Holiday decorations can be an appropriate teaching resource to highlight the cultural and religious heritage of the holiday.

Students can wish their friends a Merry Christmas by handing out religious gifts like candy canes. As the Plano, Texas school District learned in the "Candy Cane Case," if students are allowed to hand out gifts at a school party, then no one can bar children from giving religious gifts. If a school official prohibits a gift because of its religious message, then the school is demonstrating unconstitutional religious hostility.

Students can talk about their faith in school assignments. Students can express their faith in any of their personal work, which the First Amendment's protections of the freedom of speech and of religion defend all throughout the year. Student work should be graded on the basis of academic standards, not on religious content.

But remember, Christians are not the only ones with holidays in December, Jews celebrate Hanukah, the miraculous victory over the Maccabees, and Muslims commemorate the birth of Muhammed. Public schools can teach about all religions. Religious freedom includes everyone.
